

# How To Prevent The Zika Virus

## Zika Virus

The spread of the Zika virus is a mosquito-borne virus that has been associated with birth defects and a potentially severe neurological disorder in adults

## Human Symptoms

Most people infected with West Nile virus do not show any signs of illness. However, some individuals may have "flu-like" symptoms 3 to 15 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito. Symptoms include fever, headache, body-aches, fatigue, and sometimes skin rash, and swollen lymph glands. More severe infection is less common and may be marked by headache, high fever, stiff neck, disorientation, coma, convulsions, muscle weakness, and paralysis. In a few cases, mostly among the elderly, death may occur.

## How To Prevent Infection

There is not specific treatment or known vaccine available for humans; however, you can reduce the risk of becoming infected in these ways:

- Avoid shaded areas where mosquitoes may be present.
- Limit evening outdoor activity.
- Wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Maintain window and door screening to keep mosquitoes out of buildings.
- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin and clothing. Effective repellents will contain DEET.

## Breeding Areas for Mosquitoes

Different species of mosquitoes prefer different types of standing water in which to lay their eggs. The presence of beneficial predators such as fish and dragonfly nymphs in permanent ponds, lakes and streams usually keep these bodies of water relatively free of mosquito larvae. However, portions of marshes, swamps, clogged ditches and temporary pools and puddles are all prolific mosquito breeding sites. Other sites in which some species lay their eggs include:

- Tree holes
- Old tires
- Buckets
- Toys
- Potted plant trays and saucers
- Plastic covers or tarpaulins
- Places as small as bottle caps

## Remove Mosquito Habitats

- Get rid of standing water in rain gutters, old tires, buckets, plastic covers, toys or any other container.
- Change the water in bird baths, fountains, wading pools, rain barrels and potted plant once a week.
- Drain temporary pools of water or fill with dirt.

## OPEN BURNING RULES

\*Fuel for a residential outdoor fire shall be limited to natural gas, propane, commercially available charcoal or charcoal briquettes. The fire shall not be utilized for waste disposal purposes.

\*Any residential outdoor fire shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished.

\*Residential outdoor fires in approved containers shall be located no less than 15 feet from any structure.

\*It shall be unlawful for any person to burn an outdoor fire on residential property between the hours of 11 p.m. and 8 a.m.

\*No residential outdoor cooking fire shall produce an excess amount of smoke.

\*Bonfires on residential property are prohibited. Bonfires on non-residential property shall comply with the regulations contained in the International Fire Code.
