**12 AUDIENCE-AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CITIZEN PARTICIPATION**

Members of the audience who would like to address the City Council this evening may do so under the Audience portion by filling out the designated form. You will have three minutes to speak.

Patricia Dzieciolowski appeared before the Council and stated she was in an area of Warren that floods frequently and she was one of the 18,000 from this last storm. She appreciates everything the Council was doing to rectify the problem. She thinks everyone was aware that infrastructure needs to be maintained. Pumping stations need to be maintained, security needs to be kept on anything that affects the public. Health of individuals in

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the City as well as individuals in all cities and she wants the Council to be encouraged to continue to rectify the situation with the sewers and she knows there were other areas that were hit worse than hers. Schoenherr nears Hayes had a lot of damage done. She wants the Council to keep trucking on, she has lost more in that house than what she can do with. Her children have urged her to move several times and there wasn't anybody that was going to buy her house. Just keep the health of the citizens in their best efforts.

Sue Lewandowski appeared before the Council and stated she was amazed at how the clean-up went on the trash people, they did a tremendous job. She was here tonight to urge the Council to support the lawsuit against proposal 1. Her family moved to Warren in 1959 because the houses in Detroit were so expensive and they could not afford it. She remembers her mother saying that the taxes on the house would always be low because General Motors and Chrysler and all of the businesses made parts for cars would pay the majority of the taxes. A lot has changed in 55 years, corporate America is not paying percentage wise what they did in 1959, much has been shifted to the home owners. Proposal 1 would take more money away from the City and other municipalities. She was shocked when people voted for it. Proposal 1 would stabilize school funding when it was so complicated? School funding was very complicated and the Governor has already taken away a billion dollars from education and in her opinion he has destroyed the teacher training system. Did the Council know that once a teacher gets a Bachelor's Degree in education you never have to go back to school again. He was saving teachers from having to pay tuition by providing low cost, state provided CEU's. There is a big difference. The University teaches you how to think. The State Department teaches you how to comply. Several weeks before the election she received a call stating all the wonderful things about Proposal 1, stabilizing schools, fire and police departments, create jobs and the Governor supports it and they wanted her support. She replied to the caller that it was her understanding that the money stays within the local municipalities and the guy on the phone says they were not suppose to answer questions. She was a member of the tax review board in Warren and every year more and more people come in that have lived 40 to 50 years in their homes that cannot afford the taxes. Council has a responsibility to the people of Warren and Council should support the lawsuit. Thank you.

Sam Durante appeared before the Council and stated he was here to thank the City and all the different departments for all the hard work they have done during the flood. He resides in the City and he manages over two dozen properties and knock on wood he came unscaved. He came to the last City Council meeting and approached a Councilmember after and said

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his company would volunteer to clean-up a senior citizen's home and also provide a furnace to code and pay for it. That Councilmember never contacted him after two weeks. He asked, was there not a needy senior in this town that he could give to, everyone was taken care of? This Councilmember has stated they have been left out of the loop, well now he has been left out of the loop and felt there was shame for going around saying how much one person does. What wasn't done was a return phone call to him. He has heard time and time again people to claim that they did not receive a phone call or get that message. Shame on them because a senior citizen could have been provided for and he was sorry he did not want to provide for the church. He did not think the church in this situation was a necessity but a senior's home was a necessity, he wants to give. Tell them the next time a crying call comes in.
