





# City of Warren Mayoral Proclamation 2015 – 80th Anniversary of Social Security

**Whereas:** The Social Security Act was signed into law by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt on August 14, 1935, establishing the beginning of a new social insurance system that today protects families against income loss due to retirement, disability, or death of an income provider and assists in meeting some of the medical expenses of the elderly and long-term disabled, and;

**Whereas:** The Social Security program is the cornerstone of economic protection on which workers can build additionally through pensions, insurance, savings, and other income towards a comfortable retirement, and;

**Whereas:** Over 23,560 Warren residents receive over \$28.932 million monthly through some type of Social Security benefits, and;

**Whereas:** Most people think of retirement as something far off in the distant future often leading them to think “Someday I’ll get around to making plans for retirement.” However, at each stage of your life, My Social Security is

for you. Your personal online My Social Security account is a valuable source of information beginning in your working years and continuing throughout the time you receive Social Security benefits, and;

**Whereas:** Opening a My Social Security account at [socialsecurity.gov/myaccount](http://socialsecurity.gov/myaccount) is safe, convenient, and secure. You can access your Social Security Statement, review your earnings, and get estimates of future retirement, disability, and survivor benefits you or your family may receive, and;

**Whereas:** If you already receive Social Security benefits, you can use your account to manage those benefits, get an instant benefit verification letter, change your address and phone number, and start or change direct deposit of your payment.

**Now, therefore, I, James R. Fouts, Mayor of Warren, do hereby proclaim the year 2015 to be the 80th Anniversary of the Social Security Act.**

Fouts said this action shows the city has compassion. “Whenever we can, we try to meet the recreational needs of those with special needs,” said Fouts.

Fouts said the city recreation programs for those with special needs include a basketball league, a social group, and Karate and Bokwa fitness classes.

### PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM (AGES 4 AND UNDER)

**Parent-Infant:** With the parent's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages 2 and under.

**Parent-Tot:** With the parent's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required for those under. For ages 2 to 4.

**Preschool 1:** For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages 3-4.

**Preschool 2:** For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no assistance in this class. For ages 3-4.

**Preschool 3:** Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages 3-4.

### LEVEL PROGRAMS (AGES 5 AND UP)

**Level 1:** Students will learn to go underwater and learn basic skills. For ages, 5-10.

**Level 2:** For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages 5-10.

**Level 3:** Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages 5-12.

**Level 4:** Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages 6-14.

**Level 5:** Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming. Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages 7-14.

**Level 6:** Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages 8-14.

### TEEN PROGRAM (AGES 10-15)

**Beginner Teen:** This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages 10-15.

**Intermediate Teen:** This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages 10-15.

**Advanced Teen:** This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages 10-15.

### ADULT PROGRAM (AGES 16 AND UP)

**Beginner Adult:** For those that have never swam before, and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.

**Intermediate Adult:** For those that have completed the Beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able to swim independently before enrolling. 



The Silver Star service banner indicates a family member who suffered wounds or injury while in the military during time of war and is dedicated to supporting and assisting wounded, ill, injured and dying active duty and veterans and their families of all branches of service from all wars.

Silver Star Service's goal is to recognize the sacrifice of wounded and those with injuries and illnesses originating in a war zone and to remember their efforts by honoring them with the Silver Star service banner.

Qualifications include: Purple Heart recipients, victims of friendly fire, those who suffer from PTSD, Agent Orange effects and Gulf War syndrome.

## Highlights of Standard and Poor's Reports on Warren's Finances

### Strong Management

- We view the city's management as strong with "good" financial policies and practices.
- It has a three-year financial plan that includes the current budget year plus two years, which includes projected revenues, expenditures, and year-end fund balances. The city updates the plan annually and shares it with the council.
- The city has a debt policy that adheres to state guidelines.

### Strong Budget Performance

- Warren's budgetary performance is strong in our opinion. The city had operating surpluses of 13.9% in the general fund and 12.0% across all governmental funds in fiscal 2014.
- Fiscal years 2013 and 2014 closed with large surpluses in the general fund. The total governmental funds also reported surpluses, which is somewhat unusual for mature cities with capital needs.
- The city is utilizing a portion of its reserves to fund its retiree health care fund. We expect budgetary performance to remain at least adequate.

### Rationale

- Adequate economy with projected per capita effective buying income.
- Strong management with "good" financial policies and practices under our financial management assessment
- Strong budgetary performance
- Strong debt and contingent liability position

### Very Strong Budgetary Flexibility

- Warren's budgetary flexibility is very strong
- In our opinion, Warren's liquidity is very strong, with total government available cash of 87.2% of total governmental fund expenditures.

### Strong Debt and Contingent Liability Profile

- In our view, Warren's debt and contingent liability profile is strong.

### Outlook

- The stable outlook reflects our view that Warren will maintain its very strong budgetary flexibility and liquidity.

- AA/Stable

# Warren's Sidewalk Repair Program Improves Value and Appearance of Properties

The City of Warren recognizes the importance of maintaining its sidewalks. Well-maintained walkways not only look good, they can add value to a home and may even protect a pedestrian from injury.

While most of the sidewalks in Warren were constructed in the early 1960's, there are some concrete walkways in the south end that are nearly 75 years old. Over time, these sidewalks can break or become damaged from weathering and everyday use, creating a safety hazard.

In 2001, Warren launched its city-wide Sidewalk Repair Program to ensure that all sidewalks remain safe and accessible for residents and visitors. Since the program's inception, the city has repaired over 160 miles of concrete walkway.

"Inspectors actually go out looking for defects in sidewalks," said Warren Civil Engineer Art Sohlin. "They look for sidewalks with lips. Sidewalks that are cracked, pitted or scaled, or ones where large amounts of water are puddling."


Inspectors canvas a quarter of a square mile of the city annually.



## City Sidewalk Snow Removal Policy

Warren City ordinances require that all property owners remove snow from their sidewalk within 12 hours after the snow stops. This applies to all property owners, residential, commercial and industrial. Citations with fines up to \$1,000 may be issued to violators.


Warren Code of Ordinances, Section 34-60: "the occupant of any premises, or owner of any unoccupied premises, is required to keep the sidewalks in front of or adjacent to such premises cleared, so far as is practical and reasonable, from snow and ice to facilitate pedestrian use.

"Where there is not sidewalk, the occupant or owner shall clear a path free from snow and ice where sidewalk would otherwise be to facilitate pedestrian use. Whenever any snow or ice has fallen or accumulated, it shall be cleared within 12 hours after it has fallen or accumulated."

## City Snow Alert Policy

- The Mayor declares a snow alert.
- The snow alert is announced on radio and TV broadcasts, including TV Warren, the city's cable station.
- Within six hours after the Mayor's snow alert announcement, all motor vehicles and trailers MUST be removed from any city street.
- Vehicles which have a license plate or properly placed placard designating the vehicle for disabled parking are EXEMPT from the parking restriction.
- Those vehicles with disabled parking license plates or placards should be parked AS CLOSE TO THE CURB AS POSSIBLE.
- Once a street is cleared of snow or ice for the ENTIRE LENGTH of the snow alert, parking restrictions are lifted.

## Snow Removal Facts


- The Warren DPW maintains 316 miles of local roads, 65 miles of major roads and many bridges.
- Normal clearing time of all city roads is 24 hours after the storm has ended (Depending on depth of snow)
- Plowing of all side streets will be done if accumulation of snow is over 4 inches.
- The salt barn capacity is 5,000 tons.
- Average use of salt is 10,000 tons annually.
- Warren DPW is budgeted to plow out the entire city at least 10 times per year (average 2 to 3 times per year).
- Under Mayor Fouts' administration, streamlined maps and computerized salt applications have been added to provide more efficient services at a reduced cost.

## Snow Removal Road Priorities

- Main Roads: 9 Mile, 11 Mile, 13 Mile, Chicago, Hoover, Ryan
- Half Miles: Toepfer, Stephens, Frazho, Martin, Common, Masonic
  - Designated School Routes
  - Designated Local Access Streets (into subdivisions)
- Residential Streets (as necessary with accumulations over 4")
