Supplies were donated by Warren businesses, city employees and the public.

Walmart on 12 Mile and Van Dyke reached out this year presenting gift cards to each teacher at Carlson Elementary School to purchase additional supplies needed for their classrooms.

Fouts said this year's drive resulted in double the donations compared to last year's drive.

"Individuals and businesses from all areas of our city donated a variety of school supplies that the students or the school could not afford," said Fouts. "These supplies will help to make a better learning environment."

The Medical Marijuana Problem



Mayor's Corner

We have problems associated with the growing of medical marijuana in residential areas.

The growth of marijuana is out of control with plants growing unrestrained in homes. My proposal puts restrictions on the growth to protect the public health and safety of our neighborhoods.

A Warren home exploded last year caused by abuse of the medical marijuana state law. City Fire Department officials said the explosion was so violent that a freezer door was blown 35 feet through the rear of the home. Fire officials also said the explosion was caused by a medical marijuana processor using highly flammable butane to manufacture the drug.

The Fire Department reported 16 similar incidents of explosions in Michigan from marijuana growth in homes.

I was contacted by residents who said marijuana-growing homes in Warren were causing offensive odors and heavy traffic in their neighborhoods. That's why the ordinance includes provisions that mandate a filtration apparatus be added to the ventilation and exhaust systems. This provision confines the odors to the interior of the building.

Other provisions my proposed ordinance include:

- If a room with windows is utilized for growing or cultivating medical marijuana, any lighting methods that exceed usual residential periods between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. shall employ shielding methods.

- Any resident who wants to grow marijuana would have to get a license from the city's Building and Safety Inspections Division and receive approval after submitting a plan, including energy usage and heat levels in the growing room. Growing marijuana without registrations and inspections could result in a misdemeanor penalty up to a 90-day jail sentence or a \$500 fine, or both.

- The qualifying patient, or his or her primary caregiver, shall not distribute, transfer or sell the medical marijuana to another person from his or her residence, and no person shall be allowed access to medical marijuana on a qualifying patient's property other than the qualifying patient and his or her primary caregiver.

- Restrictions on the medical marijuana transport or possession in a vehicle (in a locked case)

The immediate problem is to control marijuana growing and distribution in residential neighborhoods.

The second part of my ordinance states that medical marijuana can only be grown, cultivated and stored in manufacturing districts which would end these centers being located in residential areas.

It is interesting to note that after I introduced this ordinance to the city council, neighboring communities now are adopting ordinances restricting the location of medical marijuana facilities.

Unfortunately, the problem of medical marijuana is growing because, instead of pot for patients, it is becoming pot for profit.



PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM (AGES, 4 AND UNDER)

Parent-Infant: With the parent's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages 2 and under.

Parent-Tot: With the parent's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages 2 to 4.

Preschool 1-For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages 3-4.

Preschool 2-For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no assistance in this class. For ages 3-4.

Preschool 3-Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages 3-4.

LEVEL PROGRAMS (AGES, 5 AND UP)

Level 1: Students will learn to go underwater and learn basic skills. For ages, 5-10.

Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages 5-10.

Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/back crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages 5-12.

Advanced Teen: This class is for students who can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages 10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM (AGES, 16 AND UP)

Beginner Adult: For those that have never swum before and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.

Intermediate Adult: For those who have completed the beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able to swim independently before enrolling. People say design trends may change, but quality craftsmanship never goes out of style. And no one believes that more than Gary Natschke, owner of R & D Kitchen, 24238 Mound Rd. near 10 mile in Warren.

Natschke has been making custom cabinetry alongside his brother and two other family members for over 40 years. "Warren is a very business-friendly city," said Natschke. "It's a good place to do business. I get up every morning and look forward to going to my shop."

Natschke makes kitchen cabinets, entertainment centers, vanities and toy chests, basically anything that would qualify as a cabinet.

"If a customer has a vision of what they want, I can talk them through the design process and create it," said Natschke. "I work with every type of wood, laminate and thermoplastic."

One of Natschke's biggest clients is Henry Ford Health System, where he has been designing cabinets in emergency rooms, reception areas and offices for the last 35 years.

When asked about the latest trends in home cabinetry, Natschke said, "Everything old becomes new again." "The rules have relaxed," said Natschke. "It's not so cut-and-dried, which is good news for married couples that have a hard time agreeing. We can find a way to make everyone happy."

Financial Services Wins by Putting Families First

Financial Services of America, the winner of the Top Workplaces Award in the small business category, has been a contender five times – even winning once before.

But President and CEO Richard James said he's constantly trying to improve.

Each year that the 90-employee financial services company didn't win the top award (and even the one year it did), James said, he used the data from the Top Workplaces survey to put together a plan to try and make the company better. Judging by their performance this year, the formula is working.

"The first year, the data showed our people didn't feel they got enough of a connection with the leadership," he said. "So I put a mentor program together, and now I meet with every single employee for 15 minutes, at least once every two weeks. We are trying to give our employees what they feel they need."

The company, which is based in Warren with a second office in Grand Rapids, offers a combination of financial services – insurance, accounting, estate planning, mortgage and investment – aimed at customers James refers to as middle-class America.

"What I visualized in my mind was that the middle class wasn't being served," he said. "All the planners and all the insurance agents wanted to work with high net-worth income, and I thought the people with the biggest problem were the middle class."

Financial Services' guiding philosophy, James said, is something he calls "family first."

"Without question, the top priority here is we let our employees know that their families are the priority at all times," James said. "If they need to go to the dentist, go to a baseball game, a ballerina show, they don't even have to ask. They put it in their schedule and attend their family function. Their company will be here."

A life insurance salesman who wanted to do more, James started the private company in 1985.

He ended up marrying one of his employees, Jone, who, he said, convinced him when they had young children that he should offer the people who worked for him the same opportunities he had as the owner, to take time off to spend time with their families.

"In her mind, if we take time off for our children, our employees should be able to do the same thing," he said.

Now two of his three children also work in the company.

James credits "95% of everything we do" to ideas that his employees come up with and he offers them a chance to become owners of the company, too.

Hiring – especially hiring people smarter than he is, he said – is the key to success to any business. He said he interviews every person before they are hired.

"Slowly, but surely, I've added more employees and services and I've had a great run," he said. "Hire great people, treat them properly and build a strong relationship with them."

And the Top Workplaces Award helps recruit talent – and lend credibility – to the company.

"We are an organization of relationship builders," James said. "So I'm looking for people who are family-oriented who want to provide a service to the community. It sounds a little corny, but I'm looking for people who care more about the services they provide than what they earn."

All About The Michigan Child Protection Registry

What is the Michigan Child Protection Registry?

The Michigan Child Protection Registry was created by the Michigan Legislature in 2004 as a do-not-contact service for Michigan families. The Michigan Child Protection Registry is a free, state-administered program that allows Michigan's families to protect their households from adult-oriented messages.

What addresses are eligible for registration?

You can register e-mail addresses; mobile phone numbers (SMS), instant messenger IDs, and fax numbers.

What types of adult-oriented messages are my addresses protected from?

Addresses are protected from messages that advertise pornography, tobacco, illegal drugs, alcohol, and gambling. The newest effort for these types of companies is to text their ads to any cell phone numbers they can find.

Does the registry only protect children?

No. The Michigan Child Protection Registry can include:

- Family addresses (both adults and children)
- Addresses in a household where a child is present
- School domains (students and educators)

How much does it cost to sign up my addresses?

This is a free program offered to residents by the State of Michigan

How do I sign up my addresses?

Registering your addresses is quick and easy. Go to www.protectmichild.com, click "Protect Your Household Addresses" and follow the steps to register your household addresses.

How can I send my friends information on how to register?

To send your friends, family, co-workers and neighbors information on how to register, simply send them a "refer a friend" e-mail after you register, and an automatic message on the Registry will be sent to their inbox.

How often do I need to renew the registration of my addresses?

Registrations last for three years with the option to renew at any time. You will receive a notification e-mail reminding you that the three-year time period has expired.

Are my addresses safe?

Senders of messages are NEVER given registered addresses. Marketers and companies are required to submit their solicitation lists to the state, where all registered addresses are then removed and returned to the sender.

What if I receive an adult message after I sign up my addresses?

If you are contacted with a message to a registered address, you should submit the report to the Division of Consumer Protection. The process is easy and allows you to help the state investigate those companies that are not complying with Michigan's Child Protection Registry Laws.

Which state office administers the Michigan Child Protection Registry?

The Michigan Child Protection Registry is administered by the Michigan Secretary of State and enforced by the State Attorney General's Office.

Marketers pay a fee of .007 cents for each address they scrub to the state registry. Funds generated by the program are set aside to fund the Secretary of State's Office in the maintenance, promotion and upkeep for the program.


Water Division Purchases New John Deere Wheel Loader


