Report From Warren Police on Scams Against Seniors

The criminals that exclusively target elderly victims do so by committing home invasions and home repair fraud. Since initiating the Elder Crimes Task Force, we have received several reports of home invasions in Warren and surrounding communities by subjects posing as water department employees to gain access to a residence to steal money and jewelry. Ages of the victims in each case range from 79-95 years old.

Reports have also been received from elderly residents who have been victimized by suspects offering home repair at a deep discount but when the work is completed, the final cost is increased to thousands of dollars, and the victims are pressured into paying. Soon after, it is learned that the work performed was not legitimate, and often times the suspects actually damaged the home or property of the victim in the process. We have located and identified several suspects believed to be responsible for these crimes and are currently seeking warrants for their arrests.

Additional suspects have been arrested and charged with possessing forged/fraudulent identification through multiple states. Two others have been identified and taken into custody pending extradition to other states on outstanding warrants for their arrests for Elder Exploitation and Home Repair Fraud. One subject is currently on parole out of Florida for Exploitation of an Elder over \$100,000 and Burglary with Assault.

A male/female team was identified and charged for a Home Invasion that occurred in Clinton Township. where they victimized a 75-year-old resident. Warren officers located the wanted subjects and took them into custody. Additional stolen jewelry was recovered, connecting them to another home invasion that took place in Beverly Hills with an 86-year-old victim. The female was from Texas and the male has multiple alias identities.

Active investigations and surveillance continues, and we anticipate more arrests to come.

Warren Police Are Forming A Task Force To Combat Scams Against Seniors



Mayor's Corner

We have formed a task force whose sole mission will be to combat crimes and scams aimed at senior citizens in Macomb County.

Representatives of participating agencies – Center Line, Roseville, Sterling Heights and the Macomb County Sheriff's Office – will work out of the Warren Police Commissioner's Office from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. every Tuesday and Wednesday.

Two full-time patrol officers will be assigned to this task force.

Sgt. Matt Nichols will be a key representative from the Warren Police Department. He has spent years investigating various types of fraud and has developed a reputation as a national expert in elderly crime.

The task force will work aggressively to identify, arrest and prosecute those responsible for preying on the elderly through acts of fraud or terrorizing seniors.

There has been a significant spike in crimes targeting seniors in south Macomb County.

The scam artists often pose as utility repairmen telling homeowners they will check a gas line, water line, or will provide home repair at a discounted price.

These criminals are experts at what they do. They rely on that fact.

The task force concept allows police departments to combine efforts and resources in order to effectively investigate crimes that span across jurisdictional boundaries. With this approach, those responsible for crimes against seniors can be held accountable and brought to justice regardless of their transient nature.

We spend a lot of resources on investigating crimes such as shoplifting and larceny from an auto. I feel we do not spend enough resources on senior issues. It often takes a lot of time and effort to build solid cases on these crimes, and I am committed to dedicating what is necessary to protect our senior residents.

TEEN PROGRAM (AGES, 10-15)

Beginner Teen: This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages 10-15.

Intermediate Teen: This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages 10-15.

Advanced Teen: This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and backcrawl, elementary backstroke and breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages 10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM (AGES, 16 AND UP)

Beginner Adult: For those that have never swam before, and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.

Intermediate Adult: For those that have completed the Beginner class, or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able to swim independently before enrolling. Class focuses on various strokes such as the front crawl, back crawl, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke and butterfly. Correct form/technique will be taught.

Advanced Adults: For those that are strong swimmers and want to get a swim team type workout. This class will include proper stretches, warm-ups, workouts and cool downs.



PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM (AGES, 4 AND UNDER)

Parent-Infant: With the parent's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages 2 and under.

Parent-Tot: With the parent's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required for those under 3. For ages 2 to 4.

Preschool 1-For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages, 3-4.

Preschool 2-For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no assistance in this class. For ages, 3-4.

Preschool 3-Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages, 3-4.

LEVEL PROGRAMS (AGES, 5 AND UP)

Level 1: Students will learn to go underwater and learn basic skills. For ages, 5-10.

Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages 5-10.

Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages 5-12.

Level 4: Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages 6-14.

Level 5: Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming. Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages 7-14.

Level 6: Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages 8-14.





The Bunert school building was named for August and Mine Bunert, who sold land to Warren School District No. 4 in January 1875. The school was built later that year on the northeast corner of the intersection of Bunert and Martin roads. When classes ceased in 1944, it was the longest-serving, one-room school in Warren.

In 1987, the board-and-batten building was donated to the Warren Historical Society and then moved to its present location on the south side of Warren Tower High School.

The Bunert Schoolhouse


